It is our understanding that if these aspects are taken care of by the students, they will be able to showcase their thoughts in far more effective manner.





SESSION DESCRIPTION

A new interview practice technique called 'Next Level Practice' was introduced for the students and the facilitator explained this using a few examples of common interview questions. The students were also asked to send their own answers to a common interview question basis which they could get a feedback session with the coach.



SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

500+ students registered for the workshop out of which 240+ attended. There were nearly 20 questions during the Q&A session which the facilitator received. Nearly 70% of the students found the program useful and expressed an interest to understand more about the Next Level Practice technique. There were 69 responses to the question asked and the facilitator will accordingly engage with the students through a short 10-15 minute 1:1 feedback session on the phone.
